Andy Wells is the person to contact, if you need advice about safety in your home. He does visits to personal homes as well as giving presentations to groups including a couple of videos of kitchen and Christmas tree fires! He demonstrates smoke alarms, one of which is a special wireless version to connect to a vibrating modules for going under the pillow or to carry around with you especially if you are hard of hearing too. He gave us some large print leaflets and 6 braille version too! these are available from the NNAB Office in Yarmouth.

He also assured us that when he or any of his colleagues make a home visit, it will be by appointment only, never a cold call out of the blue! You can request a password security to be added to the appointment so you can be doubly sure that it is a fire officer standing outside your front door plus a very big Red Fire Engine on your street too! if you are lucky!

# Gardening Tips



The height of summer and a warm breeze brings a gardener a golden opportunity to lean back on the spade and bask in the glory of the fragrance of a summer border or the fruits of his patch and look back on the season's journey and plot the months ahead. I lean with the tingling sensation on the skin of my arms and legs of the days work, clearing 7ft nettles from an ornamental boundary hedge enclosing a large estate, wondering why such giants couldn't be grappled with in the winter when skin is covered by excess clothes as opposed to shorts and T shirt to combat the heat. Nettles are an easy weed to eradicate as their shallow yellow roots are easy to remove. Brambles are another easy rooted weed to dig out. Battle plans need to be drawn for bindweed and ground elder as my only recommendation for those are to remove plants from area and spray weedkiller twice once in spring, and again in summer, leave fallow then plant up the following year. You can also cut the bottom of a large fizzy pop bottle and spray down the neck of the bottle, enclosing weed inside which allows you to spray close to a choice plant.

Twilight is a good time to go round with a slug bucket and salted water and with glove on hand, pick them up and pop them in. The destruction of emerging shoots by slugs and snails can have a devastating effect on our plants and climbers through not enabling them to produce enough growth for photosynthesis which weakens and kills the plant. Some people prefer beer traps but I have never used slug pellets. Over the years, and as the garden matures, different roles of planting schemes become apparent as small shrubs grow into larger specimens and a sunny spot morphs into dappled shade. I am lucky as a gardener to see transformation from young growth to maturity.

Recently I was called to help in a large garden by an elderly couple who had built a pergola many years ago that had become rotten and fragmented. I reset the wood in place by winding twining stems as fat as my forearms around the cross beams and after many hours of work, I stepped back and imagined its early days, standing sleek and upright supporting the fledgling climbers of clematis, wisteria and roses. Now the roles have reversed and the plants now embrace the ageing trellis in a vice like grip through their twists and turns of life, offering strength and support to the weakening posts. Autumn is nearly upon us and is a good time to take hardwood cuttings. Cut under a leaf joint leave 2 - 3" and cut above a leaf joint. Dip in hormone rooting powder and set in pot in coldframe or greenhouse. Apply same method for larger cuttings from roses or fruit bushes and trees by inserting spade into ground, fill bottom of slit with grit and submerge cutting and push soil together again. Propagate blackberries and other fruiting shrubs by tip layering. Weigh down the tip into the soil or pot of compost with a stone. Apple trees may have produced strong vertical shoots called water shoots. Cut out or thin out this unproductive growth entirely as soon as possible.

Time to plant out new strawberry beds from their runners. Autumn and winter root vegetables are best left in ground but guard against future cold spells by layering straw around the crowns. It also helps maturity in carrots. Earth up or stake brussel sprout plants to stop them being blown over in the wind. Blueberries are now coming into their own and a mention for dahlias and gladioli which are now looking fabulous. Above all enjoy the coming autumn, the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness.

## **NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 16 JULY 2012**

- County Councillor

Norfolk County Councillor Shrimplin reported Norfolk County Council has sent letters to properties in Beach Road where their hedges are overhanging the footway.

- Hemsby Festival

The Hemsby Playing Field Management Committee had to cancelled the use of the playing field for the Festival event – a vehicle got stuck in the mud on the field.

- Trees on Kingsway grass verge overhanging parishioners properties in Barleycroft  
GYB Services Tree Officer has advised from the end of the tall Ash trees to the large Honeysuckle bush, we have proposed to remove 6 trees to ground level. These trees are either dead, in poor condition, or right on the fence line and liable to cause damage if they

haven't done so already. Their stumps will be removed or poisoned to prevent any re-growth. All the other trees will be raised and long branches cut back, 1 metre from the kerb edge, where applicable to facilitate grass cutting and the safe movement of double decker buses and other large vehicles.

- Vic Bingo sign Newport Road

Great Yarmouth Borough Council Planning Enforcement Officer has been out and advised Vic Bingo they need to apply for planning.

- Burial Ground Boundary trees

GYBServices Tree Officer attended the appointment with PCllr Craig & Ellis, but the Parish Councillors could not attend at the last minute so he carried out the inspection on his own. He has advised despite having only been lifted on one side he feels that the trees are in a safe condition along the inside of the burial ground. They may benefit from having any growth which is obstructing the street lights removed. Being in a conservation area permission was given to do this work for a two year period – so this work can be carried out. This will be looked into.

- Burial Ground Area to scatter ashes

The Parish Council hasn't a Policy or Regulations for people who wish to scatter loved ones ashes, which means you can just scatter ashes without notifying the Parish Council, if you wish to discuss the matter then could you contact the Parish Clerk (Tel 731625).

The area will from time to time be raked and watered to disperse the dust and ashes left on the surface.

Doctors Meeting 25th June 2012 Ormesby Surgery.

Parish Councillors Eden & King attended with representatives of Hemsby W.I and a representative from Hemsby Monday Club, so there was a nice turnout for Hemsby.

Hemsby W.I representative brought up about physiotherapy referrals, people are unhappy with a telephone assessment, that lasts up to 45 mins, people were also querying how someone can possibly assess over the phone. Also the very long waiting time to get to see a physiotherapist.

Several people brought up the subject choose and book referrals, for hospital appts. people thought it was confusing and didn't get the results that they expected, this was all taken on board by Sharon, Practice Manager.

Brian, representing Ormesby PC, explained that he had put in a bid for a minibus and if successful it could be used to transport people to and from the Martham Gym. Sharon was going to make all the surgeries aware of this.

Ormesby surgery is trying out telephone triage.

Hemsby surgery is offering more appointments with reduced telephone consulting times.

Sharon has said that the practice is moving towards offering better continuity of Dr's on one site as several people brought up the fact that when you book an appt you have to keep seeing different Dr's and if you have on going health issues you have to explain everything again and again to different Dr's.

P.M Closures will remain in place at surgeries.

Mrs Tuton, a Public Governor at JPH, reported that the JPH has recruited 50 Staff Nurses, some wards and areas are now fully compliant with CQC standards, generally the standards have improved.

Sharon has requested that a chairperson and secretary be appointed as she feels she cannot give her full attention to the job in hand. It was Dr Hems last meeting.

Next meeting Caister Surgery on 1st October with Dr Dalton in attendance.

c. North Road parking restrictions

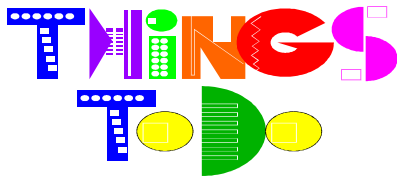
Norfolk County Council is chasing to see when the amendments will be implemented.

The Police be requested to put a wire across the road to gauge the speed of traffic.

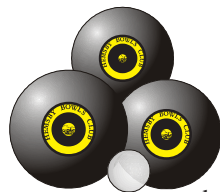
