Why is a Hot Dog called a Hot Dog?

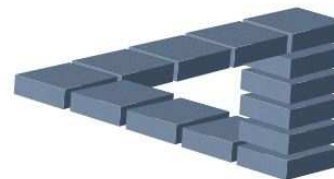
